A Letter from Bishop Mark to All Clergy, Religious, and Parish Members Summer Cereal Collection for Children – July 20-21

I have recently been reminded that many children in our area are going hungry because the free or reduced-price meals they receive in school are unavailable during the summer recess. Hunger has harmful effects on a child's learning during the summer. That's when a phenomenon called "summ slide" can be intensified without proper nutrition.

Research shows that summer hunger and food insecurity can cause physical and mental health problems and lead to poor performance in class when school begins again. In the meantime, food-insecure children experience higher rates of depression, anxiety and other mental health problems. Children, especially young children, who don't have enough to eat have more issues with language and motor skills (Read more at https://www.feedthechildren.org/campaigns/summer-hunger/).

But something can be done. A local effort is being made to collect cereal for children in need. The target date is the weekend of July 20-21. I am urging our parishes to promote the collection of breakfast cereal that can easily be brought to church during the coming weeks. It would be a great idea for children of all ages to bring boxes of cereal each weekend for the rest of the summer.

The Gospel reminds us that he Lord Jesus was filled with compassion for the crowd who had nothing the moved him to feed the crowd in an abundant manner (Mt. 15:32ff). Your contribution to the collection is an awesome way to put into practice the grace of the Eucharistic Revival that is taking in the Church. Please be generous!

Stewardship Reflections

July 7, 2024 - 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our readings today portray three figures that experienced challenges – Ezekiel, St. Paul and Jesus. It is a reminder for us that, even in our weakest and toughest moments, God has a plan.

As Christian stewards, we are not always accepted. It might be because of what we believe in, the principles we stand for, how we spend our time and money, what we choose to participate in or not, or even how we raise our families.

Today, as we hear about these three figures in the Scriptures, let us reflect on our lives. Recall that God loves us more than we could ever imagine. There is not a moment that goes by that He does not have us in mind. He has a specific plan for our lives. Therefore, may we encounter life's challenges, our weaknesses and moments of feeling unwanted with confidence in Christ.
