STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS – Oct 13, 2024 – 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In our Gospel today we hear the story of a man who ran up to Jesus and asked Him what he must do to reach eternal life. Jesus said, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." It says the man went away sad because he had much.

We might cringe when we hear this story because it is sad — this man was so close to becoming an active disciple of Jesus, but instead turned away. We also might cringe because it could be deeply applicable to our lives. If we look at our own lives, we can most likely think of something that we tightly carry with us. Maybe it is possessions — material goods or money — like Jesus references in our Gospel. Or maybe it is something less material — like status, pride or control. As we go through life, it can be hard not to cling tightly to things of the world.

May we consider what it is that is holding us back from radically loving Jesus. Pray for the grace to overcome, don't pass by the opportunities to surrender, and create moments to detach. It might seem difficult, but the outcome will be more than we could have ever imagined – peace on earth and treasure in heaven.

MESSAGE FROM BISHOP MARK REGARDING HURRICANE RELIEF EFFORTS IN OUR DIOCESE

October 10, 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In recent days, our brothers and sisters in the southeastern part of the United States have endured devastation from Hurricane Helene and Hurricane Milton. We here in the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown stand in solidarity with those individuals and families. I invite the local faithful to join me in praying for them and asking the Lord to give them strength and healing in the challenging days ahead. In a special way, we also remember those who have lost their lives and those who mourn them.

As we see the suffering of the storm victims on the news, I think I speak for everyone in expressing a great desire to help in some way. Therefore, I am asking all parishes in the Diocese of Altoona -Johnstown to take a special collection to benefit hurricane victims. All contributions to this special collection would be tax deductible. Parishes should forward the proceeds to the diocese, and I will see that those monies are forwarded to agencies such as Catholic Charities USA, which will ensure that the funds are used to help the recovery efforts. At this time, there is no need for items such as food, clothing, or toiletries to be sent to the southern states.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus reminds us that what we do for the least among us, we do for Him. In that spirit, I ask that local parishioners please be generous in the upcoming special collections, and I encourage everyone keep all those affected by the hurricanes in their thoughts and prayers. May the Lord bless them and those on the front lines who are working hard to provide aid and comfort.

Side note: The image on the collection envelope is that of Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine grotto behind St. Mary's Star of the Sea Roman Catholic Church in Key West, FL. "In 1922 Sister Louis Gabriel led a contingent of nuns and, using local coral rock, built an Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine grotto behind St. Mary's Star of the Sea Roman Catholic Church. According to local lore, she blessed the structure at its May 25 dedication and vowed, 'As long as the Grotto stands, Key West will never experience the full brunt of a hurricane.' Since that day, Key West has been in the path of several hurricanes, but has suffered surprisingly minimal damage. Locals attribute this to the dedication of Key West residents, who regularly make pilgrimages to the Grotto to light candles and pray for protection. The Grotto grounds also offer a Rosary Path -- resembling a giant loop of rosary beads with a dangling cross -- and a nun graveyard where some of the tombstones incorporate sculpted nun heads, including Sister Gabriel's." https://www.roadsideamerica.com/story/70383
